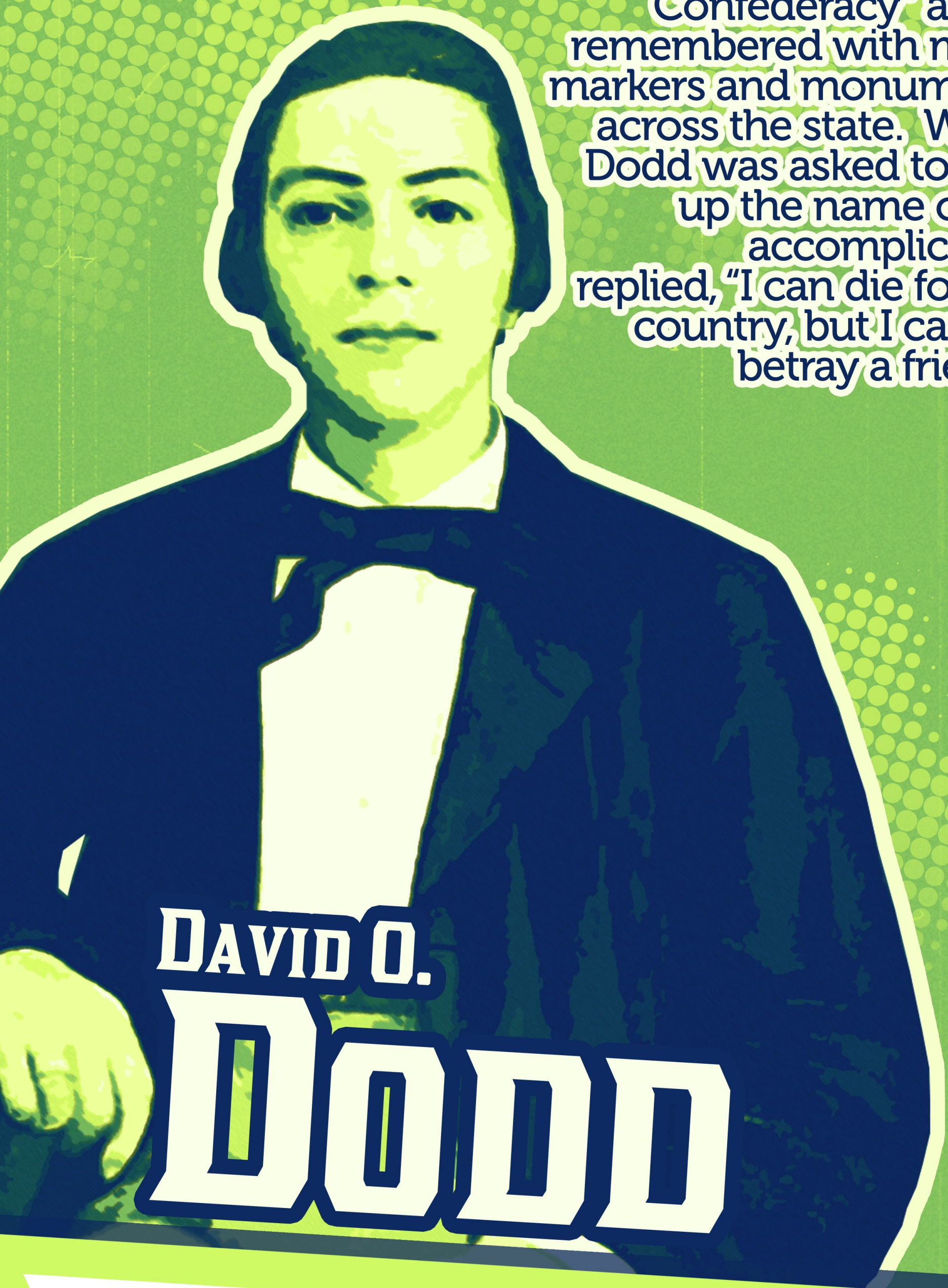


David O. Dodd (1846-1864) was hung as a Confederate spy in Little Rock during the Civil War. Dodd has been called the "Boy Martyr of the Confederacy" and is remembered with many markers and monuments across the state.
