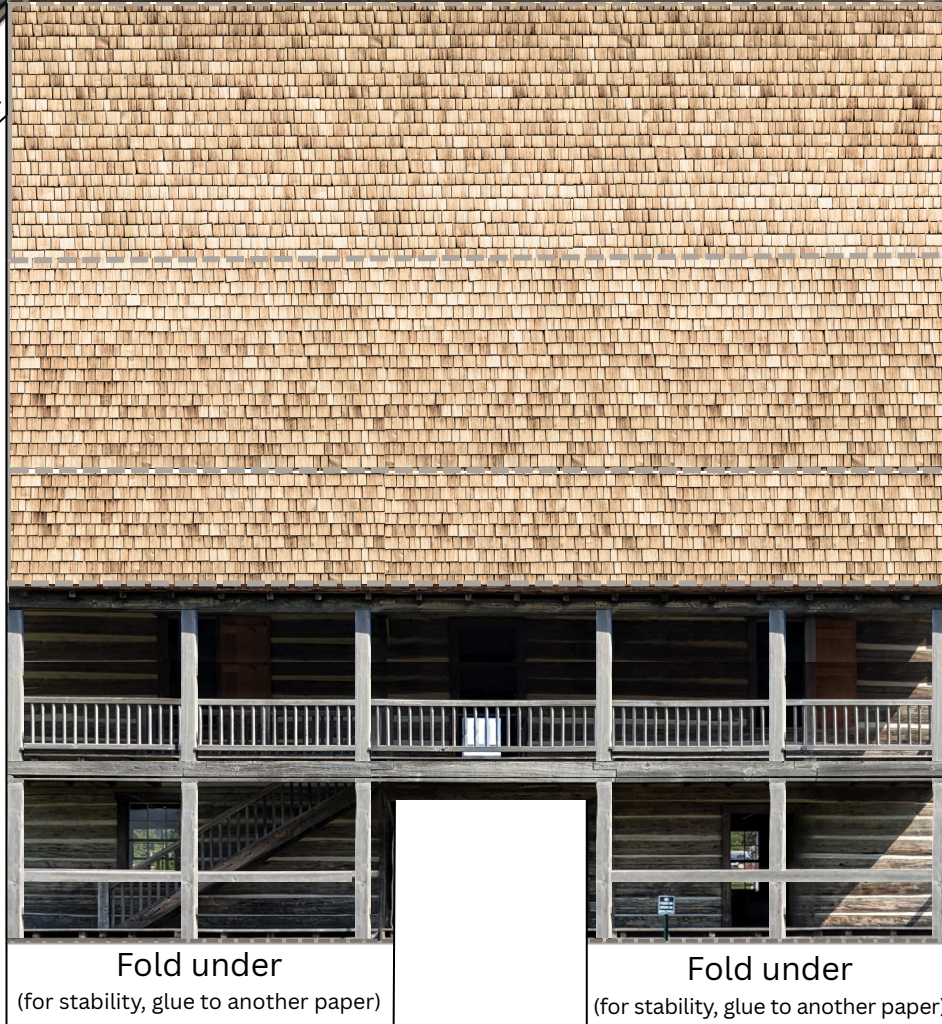


JACOB WOLF HOUSE

NORFORK, ARKANSAS

The Jacob Wolf House in Norfolk, Arkansas, is a historic two-story log house built in 1829. It was the first permanent courthouse for Izard County in the Arkansas Territory. It is the oldest public building in Arkansas and is the last remaining two-story dog-trot public structure in the United States. Situated on the route of the 1838-1839 Cherokee removal, it is a certified site on the Trail of Tears National Historic Trail.



Instructions:

Cut along solid lines to remove cabin and tabs in one piece. Clip tabs apart from each other at solid lines.

Fold cabin and tabs at dotted lines, tucking tabs under the edges of cabin.

Glue tabs to cabin to hold it together.

For stability, you can glue the cabin down to another sheet of paper using the bottom tabs.
