This full-color, softcover book contains over two hundred documents from eighty different collections at the State Archives. For over a century, the State Archives has actively collected materials from this crucial era of our state and nation's history: diaries and letters written by soldiers and citizens; military orders; newspaper accounts; photographs, and broadsides recounting the day-to-day lives of people caught up in the most significant event in nineteenth century America. This volume uses these primary source materials to tell the story of the Civil War from an Arkansas perspective.

The Journal of Captain Henry Brockman
Company K, 10th Missouri Volunteer Infantry, C.S.A.
Henry Brockman of Missouri served in the Confederate
Army during the Civil War. During his time in the
military he described his daily activities, the places he
visited, and the things he saw. As Brockman "traveled
through fine country," his tour of duty took him to
major battles in Arkansas and Louisiana, including
stops at Jacksonport, Pocahontas, Yellville, Des Arc,
Helena, Little Rock, Benton, Arkadelphia, Warren,
Camden, and Shreveport. For over 100 years, the
Arkansas History Commission (State Archives) has
preserved Brockman's writings.
