## DESCRIPTION

The Quell House is a one-and-one-half story bungalow built c. 1920. The facade, or east elevation, is distinguished by a full-length front gable porch which is supported by square stuccoed piers bearing on a low stucco wall. A centrally located flight of steps, flanked by low walls, gives access to the porch and the centered entry of the building, which is flanked by fifteen-over-one double-hung windows. The house is rectangular in plan with a side-gable overhanging roof supported by brackets. A chimney and a small bay with a shed roof protrude from the north elevation. The remainder of the windows are single or paired multipane-over-one double-hung. The exterior of the building is stucco covered chat, a fine gravel-like substance which was thrown onto the structure before the stucco was dry. Wall and piers of the front porch are only partially covered with this material, leaving a stucco border around each of their components.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Quell House is a distinctive example of post-World War I bungalows which were built in Siloam Springs. While a back porch has been recently enclosed, the property retains a high degree of integrity. The chat-over-stucco exterior was a common construction technique in the area, but the Quell House is the finest example of its application.
