

Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the northern edge of County Road 513C with a perpendicular line running parallel with the eastern end of the bridge and located approximately 25 feet to the east thereof, proceed northerly for a distance of approximately 25 feet to its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel with the bridge's northern side; thence proceed westerly along said line for a distance of approximately 80 feet to its intersection with a perpendicular line; thence proceed southerly along said line for a distance of approximately 76.1 feet to its intersection with a perpendicular line; thence proceed easterly along said line for a distance of approximately 80 feet to its intersection with a perpendicular line; thence proceed northerly to the point of beginning.

Description

Located on County Road 513C at the point where it crosses an unnamed ditch (approximately 1.5 miles east of Dixie and just east of the junction of County Roads 513C and 669 at the St. Francis Levee), the Craighead County Road 513C Bridge is of steel deck truss construction. It consists of one span measuring 76 feet, though the total length is 142 feet, as the two approach spans extend from the earthen banks to the wooden piers that support the bridge itself. Its deck width is 14.7 feet, and its overall width is 15.9 feet. Its deck material is timber over steel.



Significance

Constructed in 1942, the Craighead County Road 513C Bridge is associated with the World War II Era historic context and is of the steel deck truss type. Though the identity of its original designer does not survive, it was constructed in conjunction with the Arkansas State Highway Commission and thus may well have been designed by one of that state agency's engineers. Given its relatively intact condition it retains sufficient integrity to remain associated with its historic period; it is thus locally eligible under Criterion C.
