DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Missouri-Pacific passenger depot at Morrilton, Arkansas, is a one-story building completely faced with dark red brick. The ceiling is 12'8" high. The building is 149' long, running east and west by the Missouri-Pacific tracks. It has a hip roof with red tile for covering. The main building has five main sections: a white waiting room (25' x 31') with rest rooms for men and women in the east section (20' x 20'); a ticket office (31' x 16'1'') with a bay section (5" x 16'1") extending northward toward the railroad tracks; a black waiting room.  $(25' \times 26')$ ; an open breezeway paved with red brick  $(17'7'' \times 20')$ ; and a freight station (45'5" x 20') on the west end of the building. The windows and doors (now boarded over) are painted white as is the trim of the eaves and gabled roof-ends on the east and west. The depot occupies approximately half of the lot, the other half being equally divided into two graveled areas for parking.

The architectural style is typical of depots built in the early part of the twentieth century.

It might be noted that the signs on the east and west ends of the depot are not spelled like the name of the man who gave the right-of-way for the tracks and depot, Mr. E. J. Morrill. In spelling the name of the new town, the last "1" was omitted, and Morrill gave rise to Morrilton. Another interesting note: Morrilton, Arkansas is the only town by that name in the entire United States (according to all available gazetteers).

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

SIGNIFICANCE

The commercial and residential development of any community parallels the development of transportation throughout our nation. At first there was only sea-port trading. Then, as travel began on inland waterways, river ports became the center of commerce and civilization followed the routes of transportation.

This was the case in Conway County, Arkansas. Traffic by way of the Arkansas River brought supplies and people to the river port landing at Lewisburg. But when the Missouri-Pacific Railroad built a line from Little Rock to Fort Smith, putting the tracks through Conway County about three miles north of Lewisburg, a new town came into existence - Morrilton. Freight and passenger service brought business and people to the area north and south of the tracks where homes, schools, churches and businesses were So, after the railroad came in 1875, a thriving community was built. born, developing surely and slowly into the county seat of Conway . County. Mr. E. J. Morrill and Mr. James Miles Moose deeded land for the tracks and depot lot. The Morrill property was west of the quarter-section line; the Moose property lay to the east. It was decided to name the new town for the man on whose land the new depot was built. This was Mr. Morrill's land, so it became "Morrilton". The first street west of Division street (which divides the town into western and eastern halves) is Morrill Street: the first street east of Division Street is Moose Street.

Because of its central location in downtown Morrilton, the depot is visible from most of the major stores and businesses. The new Interstate 40 is approximately two miles north of the Missouri-Pacific tracks. As usual, new business places are opening up to be near the new freeway. In order to attract business and visitors to the older downtown area, the Morrilton Downtown Merchants Association is vitally interested in (1) preserving the reason for the origin of the town - the Missouri-Pacific Depot, (2) creating a museum in which to house items of historic value dating about the time the depot was built and through the following years of growth, (3) providing a display room where artists and craftsmen of the area can display and sell their wares, and (4) keep in repair a building of historic architectural significance. There are no more depots like the one in Morrilton. It is a sound, well-built structure, Form No. 10-300a (Rev. 10-74)
