

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#### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Constructed in 1910-11, the Crittenden County Courthouse at Marion is a two-storey, nine-bay, symmetrical building featuring south (facade) and north elevations that were built to be identical. The present courthouse replaced the 1873 structure, which burned in 1908. The Chamberlain and Company architectural firm of Fort Worth, Texas; designed the Crittenden County Courthouse, and it was built at a total cost of \$99,740.

A two-storey, five-bay portico embellishes both the south and north elevations. Six unfluted Ionic columns span both storeys of the porticos. The frieze of each portico contains the inscription, "Obedience to the law is liberty," in bold black letters. Wide steps with seven risers lead to the porticos. Both these elevations have double glass doors with transom leading into the front and rear halls Above the south entrance doors has been added a seal of the State of Arkansas. The ceilings of the porticos are pressed tin.

The east and west elevations of the courthouse comprise seven bays. The central three bays project slightly. Each of the protruding three bays is bordered by white stuccoed bands, like the stuccoed bands which mark each corner of the building.

Simple molding and plain modillions enhance the cornice of the flat roof. A large copper-colored dome rests on a raised angular platform in the center of the roof. The base of the cylindrical dome has a band of rectangular windows and air vents near its top. The roof of the dome has an octagonal urn with finial.

Inconsistant replacement of panes has resulted in both one-over-one and two-over-two sash windows in uniform fenestration. The double windows are separated by a wide mullion but share a common lintel and casement. A pair of first-floor windows on the east elevation have been infilled with brick. Originally the uniform placement and style of windows enhanced the symmetry of the structure.

The Crittenden County Courthouse sits on the courthouse square. The square contains many large trees and a well-manicured lawn, and it provides a very picturesque setting for this impressive building.

**ITATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE** 

The largest number of architecturally significant public buildings in Arkansas are the courthouses scattered over the State's seventy-five counties. A structural symbol of American government, the county courthouse serves as the center of local political activity. Often the largest and most costly building in the county, the courthouse is almost always a source of pride to the citizens who financed and make use of its facilities.

The Territorial Legislature established Crittenden County and named it after Robert Crittenden in October 1825. Crittenden was the first Territorial Secretary and the first acting governor of Arkansas Territory. Crittenden County was formed from parts of Phillips County.

Greenock served as the first county seat until 1827, but no courthouse was constructed there. In 1827 Marion became the county seat and a frame courthouse was erected. A cyclone destroyed the first courthouse several years later and in 1873 a two-storey brick courthouse was constructed in Marion. A fire in 1909 razed the 1873 building.

The present Crittenden County Courthouse in Marion was designed by the Chamberlain architectural firm of Fort Worth, Texas, in 1910-11 at a cost of \$99,740.

The Crittenden County Courthouse is a two-storey, 9-bay, brick, Greek Revival building that features identical south (facade) and north elevations. Six Ionic capitals support the porticos, and both of the friezes contain the adage "Obedience to the law is liberty," in bold black lettering.

Simple molding on the cornice and plain modillions decorate the entablature of the roofline. A large, copper-colored dome rests on a raised, angular platform on top of the flat roof.

The east and west elevations are five-bays wide, each with a three-bay, protruding, central pavilion. Both are identical except that two of the first-storey windows on the east elevation have been infilled with bricks.

The interior of the courthouse was extensively remodeled in 1945 and 1955. Lowered ceilings, paneled walls, carpeted floors, and a remodeled courtroom are the results. In the front entrance-hall, the original tile floor remains as one of the few interior architectural elements of interest. Although the interior of the courthouse has a modernized appearance, the exterior has not been altered, nor has it received any additions. The Crittenden County Courthouse sits on an attractive tree-shaded lot on the court square of the old City of Marion; it is a hand-some local landmark that is both architecturally and historically significant to Crittenden County.
