The southwest corner of the lot is bounded by a low concrete retaining wall.

At the front and center of the plot, from west to east, stand an unmarked stone block, a flagpole, and a granite marker reading: ERECTED IN MEMORY OF/OUR CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS/FROM ARK., TEX., LA., MO., AND/INDIAN TERRITORY/ HO LOST THEIR LIVES IN THE /BATTLES OF OAK HILL, ELK HORN,/AND PRAIRIE GROVE./ERECTED BY/MARY LEE CHAPTER U.D.C./OF VAN BUREN, ARKANSAS.

The lot is well maintained and in good condition.

Thus, it also meets the eligibility requirements of Criterion Considerations C (Cemeteries) and F (Commemorative Properties).

Elaboration

The 10 acres on which Fairview Cemetery are located were donated to the city in 1846 by John Drennen, one of the city's co-founders. After the outbreak of Civil War in 1861, the City of Van Buren donated a plot in which to bury Confederate soldiers who died in Van Buren or whose remains were brought there from regional battlefields. Sexton records show that some 100 Confederate soldiers were buried in the Confederate Section during the Civil War. Others were reburied their following the war after being removed from their battlefield graves. There are some 442 simple marble grave markers in the lot, ordered by the Mary Lee Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy from the U.S. government. Most are simply marked "UNKNOWN CONFEDERATE SOLDIER." The dead were believed to be from Arkansas, Texas, Louisiana, Missouri and the Indian Territory.

A monument with a marble Confederate soldier (Van Buren Confederate Monument, NR 4/26/96) was erected in the cemetery by the Mary Lee Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy in 1899 in honor of the southern dead. It was moved to a more visible location on the Crawford County Courthouse grounds in 1906 at the request of the Sons of the Confederacy.

A granite monument was erected by the Mary Lee UDC chapter. While its date is unknown, the 1908 Publications of the Arkansas Historical Association states that "the Daughters of the Confederacy are arranging to put curbing around the plot of ground and place a slab with proper inscriptions where the monument first stood."

he Confederate Lot, Fairview Cemetery, is the property most closely associated with the efforts of the City of Van Buren and the Mary Lee Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy to honor Confederate war dead. As such, it deserves recognition on the National Register of Historic Places.
