## AROHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

The Ed Knight House faces west on an unpaved county road near the community of Pine Grove. This gable roofed house, which appears to be a double pen structure was originally a log dog-trot resting on stone piers. In the late 19th century the passageway was enclosed, an ell was added to the south end of the rear facade, and the entire structure was clad in horizontal weatherboards. The front facade contains a pair of central six-over-six double-hung windows flanked by a door and a window on each side, Of particular note are the decorative facings surrounding the central windows, which extend beyond the top of the windows enclosing rectangular panels. Covering the front facade is the half hip porch roof supported by six turned posts with jigsaw cut brackets.

Statement of significance
The Ed Knight House is located just outside Pine Grove, a community settled in the 1840 's. The Knights were a prominent 19 th century farm family of the southwest portion of Dallas County. Built oxiginally as a dog-trot, the house was converted into a finely crafted double pen structure with a rear ell near the turn of the century. The Ed Knight House is an outstanding example of the traditional evolution of the dog-trot plan in Dallas County. The enclosure of the dog-trot, in this case into a very unusual double pen plan, reflects an expression of rural affluence in the county.
