

Physical Description


Reflecting the popularity of the Tudor Revival style for collegiate architecture, this three-story college dormitory features a central block with a steep gable tile roof from which project two end pavilions with hipped roofs. The building is faced with dark red brick trimmed with limestone. Small gable roofed dormers with casement windows line the roof of the main block. The steep stepped gable parapets centered in the main block and the two end wings add to the sense of verticality of the composition. Other details reminiscent of the Tudor Revival are the casement windows grouped in an oriel window effect over the entrance, the stone hood molds over the entrance and the upper windows of the end wings, the stone Gibbs surround of the entrance and the battlemented parapet of the central block. The sash windows have Nine-over-nine lights.



Statement of Significance

Located on the edge of the Hendrix College campus, Galloway Hall is the oldest girls dormitory building at the college. Designed by Charles L. Thompson ca. 1913, Galloway Hall reflects the popularity of the Tudor and Gothic Revival Styles for college buildings at that time. The building is compatible with the other buildings on the small campus. Of red brick construction, the three-story dormitory features limestone trim. Massing includes a central block with a gable roof and two end hipped roofed pavilions. The large building is another important landmark on the campus of Hendrix College.
