

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SUMMARY

The Silas Owens, Sr., House, located at 157 Solomon Grove Road in Twin Groves was constructed in the Mixed Masonry style circa 1948. The building served as the primary residence of the well-known Faulkner County rock mason, Silas Owens, Sr., and his family. Owens' home is influenced by Craftsman massing with open rafter tails, now obscured by a fascia board, and paired windows. A Mediterranean influence can be seen in a full, arcaded front porch. Cream brick trim is used sparingly on this building; however the artistic use of stone coursing is typical of the fine masonry executed by Silas Owens, Sr.

ABORATION

The Silas Owens, Sr., House is a rectangular plan on a concrete foundation with a gabled and clipped gable roof. The sloping lot provides space for a partial basement at the rear of the building. The home was altered with the replacement of original wood windows with two-over-two aluminum sashes in the early 1990s; however, with the application of one-over-one storm windows this modern alteration is less evident and presents a more appropriate appearance. The original window openings are also the same dimension. The home was constructed with a tin roof, which was replaced at the same time as the windows with composition shingle. Neither of these modifications detracts from the original form or the creative rockwork, which is the hallmark of a Silas Owens, Sr., Mixed Masonry.

South Elevation

The northern, front elevation of the Silas Owens, Sr., House presents a full, arcaded porch. The three baskethandle arches of the porch are outlined to the area of the spring with cream bricks. A small one-over-one window at the apex of the gabled porch roof is outlined in a header and stretcher pattern of

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cream bricks. This elevation is fenestrated on the west and east corners with a pair of two-over-two, double-hung aluminum windows flanking a single-leaf front door. The typical Silas Owens, Sr., use of header and stretcher patterns in brick around the windows is absent on this house and is replaced with a wide concrete lintel and concrete sill.

East Elevation

A single, narrow baskethandle arch trimmed with cream brick is located at the northeast end of the porch. The eastern elevation is fenestrated north to south with a pair of windows, a single opening and two more pairs of windows. A single-light stationary basement window topped with a concrete lintel is uated beneath the paired windows at the southeast corner.

South Elevation

The rear, southern elevation contains a pair of short double-hung windows at the southeast corner. The roof on this elevation features a jerkinhead gable on hip and a narrow shed roof supported by two square posts extends over the pair of windows to the southeast. A small arcaded porch with rock half-wall capped with concrete and two baskethandle arches extends a few feet south from the back wall. The porch is reached by a short flight of concrete steps. Two adjacent single-leaf doors open onto the back porch.

West Elevation

The southwest corner of the back porch features a single arch. A gabled bay extends approximately two feet west from the main wall flanking the back porch. A single double-hung window is centered in the bay. Two jagged shards of broken mirror glass are placed within the mortar joints above the window.

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SUMMARY

The Silas Owens, Sr., House in Twin Groves, Arkansas, constructed circa 1948 is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places with local significance under Criterion C as a good example of a Craftsman and Mediterranean influenced Mixed Masonry residence. The Faulkner County home was constructed and veneered by master craftsman Silas Owens, Sr., and features the creative stone coursing emblematic of Owens work. The nomination is being submitted under the multiple property context, "A Storm Couldn't Tear Them Down: The Mixed Masonry Buildings of Silas Owens, Sr., 1938-1955."

ELABORATION

The Silas Owens, Sr., House was built circa 1948 by Silas Owens, Sr., to serve as the principal residence for his wife, Georgia and their six children. The main vocation of most of the African American families in Twin Groves atop Batesville Mountain in Faulkner County was farming and Silas, Sr.'s, family as a whole participated in raising foodstuffs grown on their property. Owens' true love though was masonry and he trained his children – boys and girls – in laying bricks and stone. After Silas Owens, Sr.'s, death in 1960 the home remained in the family and his daughter Pauline Morris continues to reside there with her son Jeffery Morris.

The town of Twin Groves was not incorporated until 1991 but the area retains the feel of a rural, farming community. The Silas Owens, Sr., House retains its commanding view of the wooded fields and valleys

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stretching to the north and south and is thus evocative of mid-twentieth century rural life in Faulkner County and Twin Groves.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Silas Owens, Sr., House in Twin Groves, Faulkner County, Arkansas is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places with local significance under Criterion C as an excellent example of a Craftsman and Mediterranean influenced Mixed Masonry residence featuring the superior raftsmanship of Silas Owens, Sr. The nomination is being submitted under the multiple property context, "A Storm Couldn't Tear Them Down: The Mixed Masonry Buildings of Silas Owens, Sr., 1938-1955."
