The land that would comprise Lake Catherine State Park was acquired by the Arkansas State Parks Commission c. 1935 as part of its on-going efforts to add new recreational areas to the Arkansas State Parks system that had began in 1923 with the acquisition of the land that would form Petit Jean State Park. This property on Lake Catherine was acquired for development as a state park due to the formation of the lake by the damming of the Ouachita River by Remmel Dam in 1923-24 that single-handedly created the property's recreation and leisure potential.

Cabin #2 was constructed c. 1935 at Lake Catherine State Park by the men of the 3777th Company of the Civilian Conservation Corps, Arkansas District, stationed at Friendship, Arkansas as a temporary residential building to be used by the park's visitors for overnight accommodations. This facility was constructed by the CCC as part of the overall plan to develop this site as a public park to be administered by the state of Arkansas.

This building was erected at Lake Catherine State Park by the men of the Civilian Conservation Corps for the purpose of overnight accommodations for park visitors, and was intended to serve those visitors by providing comfortable, modern facilities to enhance the quality of their stay. Thus Cabin #2 is eligible under Criterion A for its associations with both the Civilian Conservation Corps' importance within Arkansas social history and its role in the development of outdoor parks dedicated to public leisure and recreational activities. It is also eligible under Criterion C due to its status as a representative and intact example of the Rustic style of architecture that was made popular nationwide by the CCC, and which has since become virtually identified with it.
