SUMMARY

The Mount Zion Presbyterian Church is a one-story gable-roofed building, rectangular in plan. Constructed in 1925, it is of Craftsman design with distinctive neoclassical detailing.

ELABORATION

The Mount Zion Presbyterian Church is sited at the top of a hill along Arkansas Highway 81, with a tree-shaded lot and cemetery to its north. The principal (west) facade's gable-oriented high-pitched roof has overhanging eaves supported by brackets. A recessed entry which leads to double doors is supported by Tuscan columns, two free-standing flanked by two engaged. Carpentry work in the weatherboard siding above the entry forms a simple arch motif with plain detailing. The entry is flanked by narrow pairs of six-over-six double-hung windows with keystones above. The side (north and south) elevations of the church are identical. A slightly-projecting bay pierces the center of each elevation, with gable roof and a trio of double-hung windows, the center of which is twelve-over-twelve and the flanking each nineover-nine. On each side of the bay is a pair of nine-over-nine windows, and a single nineover-nine window at the end of each elevation completes the fenestration pattern. The roof has wide overhanging eaves with exposed rafters.

The rear (east) elevation possesses little detail except the brackets under wide eaves. Two five-panel doors, one on each side of the elevation, are no longer used and steps which once led to them have been removed.

The building is sheathed in weatherboard and has a brick foundation. The metal roof is pierced at the northwest and southeast by brick chimney flues.

The interior of the Mount Zion Presbyterian Church reflects its rectangular design. Wooden pews contemporary to the building's construction date flank a center aisle which leads to the wide-arched altar. Original beaded-board wainscoting remains, as do globe light fixtures. Plaster walls have been covered with pressed-wood panelling and original ceiling has been covered with asbestos tiles, although original height and gambrel shape of ceiling remain.

8. Significance



Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

SUMMARY

The Mount Zion Presbyterian Church is a significant building architecturally. A twentiethcentury interpretation of the traditional country church, its Craftsman style and neoclassical detailing make it an unusual example of its type.

ELABORATION

The Mount Zion Presbyterian Church was constructed in 1925 for a congregation which had been formed by early settlers of the area in 1859. The carpenter was Charlie Blakely of the nearby Rock Springs community, and most of the actual construction of the building was done by church members. The brackets and exposed rafters typical of Craftsman design, while common to residences of the period, are unusual in a religious building. The columned entryway, along with its arched detailing and keystones above the windows, probably indicate Mr. Blakely's interest in classical architecture, and are instrumental to the significance of the building.

Descendants of the settlers who founded Mount Zion Presbyterian Church still attend services there, although little remains of the original communities it serviced, Relfs Bluff, Montongo, and Plantersville. Its significance lies in its distinctive design detailing, however, and it is being nominated under Criterian C for that reason.
