### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Located at the intersection of State Highways 10 and 23, the Bank of Booneville Building is one of the earliest buildings built in the business district of Booneville. Prior to 1900, the business district of Booneville was located south of where it is now along what is now First Street (formerly Railroad Avenue). Shortly after 1900, the business district moved a few blocks north of the railroad to where it is now and the Bank of Booneville Building is located in the center of this area.

The building was constructed in 1902 as a brick building to house the newly formed Bank of Booneville, which was chartered April 24, 1899. The main entrance is located at the building street corner and is detailed in rusticated stone, which forms a Roman arch over the door. The brick corbels out at the top and is finished with brick dentils.

With three exceptions, the building has remained unchanged structurally since its construction. When it was built, there were wooden awnings covering the entire sidewalk. These awnings were very high off the street as the attached photocopy shows. Due to wear and tear, the awnings were later taken down and replaced. The current owner, during the recent renovation of the building, has put back awnings made of canvas which were popular during the early 1900's. At some time during the life of the building, some owner covered a large area of the original brick with stucco and, at the same time, enlarged the windows.

The present owner has recently completed an extensive exterior remodeling of the building. At all times it was the intent of the owner to bring the building back to as near original condition as practical.

### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Bank of Booneville is one of the oldest buildings in the town. The building architecturally is representative of a turn of the century commercial style and most significant in its importance in the commercial development of Booneville.

Booneville, Arkansas was founded in 1878 and for several years was not an economic factor in the southern part of Logan County. However, upon the establishment of the Rock Island Depot, Booneville prospered and has since maintained a steady growth.

On April 24, 1899, several residents of Booneville chartered the Bank of Booneville. This group bought the land for the building site the following day. Until the building was constructed, the Bank operated out of a frame building about 175 feet from the site of the future bank building.

It is generally agreed that the Bank of Booneville was constructed in 1902.

Located at the intersection of State Highways 10 and 23, the Bank of Booneville Building is one of the first structures to be constructed in the present business district of the city. Prior to 1900, the city's business district was in a different section of town and redeveloped at the present location in association with the railroad industry.

The bank was closed by presidential order for liquidation purposes on October 17, 1934. It was bought at public auction shortly thereafter by a local doctor, reportedly for \$2,500. He leased out the front half to Ms. Grace Gatlin, who ran a drugstore at the location from then until the late 1960's.

"Grace," as she was known to everyone, was a great friend of the young people in the Booneville area and any long-time Booneville resident under the age of 60 and over the age of 30 can recall hours and hours of time spent at "Grace's" either at the soda fountain, the magazine rack or the "mourner's Bench." The mourner's bench is a landmark known to anyone in Booneville who has been here any length of time at all. The front window of the building has a ledge that sticks out six or eight inches about 24 inches off the sidewalk and over the years, this has provided a natural gathering place for people of all ages for all reasons. Many a story has been told from the mourner's bench.

One other unique feature of "Grace's" relates to her size. She is an extremely small woman, possibly no taller than 4' 6". When she rented the area for her drugstore, she had the floor in the prescription counter area raised approximately 30 inches so she could see what all was happening in her place of business. To this day, the back one-third of the front part of the building is still about 30 inches higher than the front two-thirds.

The building changed hands again about 1960 and has been used for miscellaneous office and store occupancies until the present. It was bought by the present occupant in August of 1976 and has been restored to as near original condition as is practical.


