## SUMMARY

The Troy Lasater Service Station, located on the State Highway 197 Loop, was built in 1935. The stone building sits atop a continuous stone foundation and is topped by an intersecting gable roof. The style of the building is best described as a vernacular treatment of English Revival, and is the best example of the particular style in New Blaine, Arkansas. The building's original windows were replaced with matching windows, but have been covered with particleboard to protect them from vandalism.

### **ELABORATION**

Located on the State Highway 197 Loop, the Troy Lasater Service Station is an excellent example of simplified English Revival architecture. The rectangular shaped building is constructed of native stone and rests upon a continuous stone foundation. All of the building's windows have been covered with particleboard to protect them from vandals, but are intact. The one remaining outbuilding associated with the property is a native stone privy. The single pump that was located at the front of the building has been temoved.

### **Northwest Elevation-Front**

The building faces the northwest towards State Highway 197. The defining feature of the front elevation is the steeply pitched intersecting front gable. The over hang created by the gable shelters the entryway to the building. The door still functions, but the glass upper portion of the door is covered in particleboard. The façade is also fenestrated by two six-over-six double-hung windows supported by concrete sills. The windows have been covered with particleboard.

### Southwest & Northeast Elevation/ Sides

The sides of the building are identical with very simple details. Each side is fenestrated by a centrally located six-over-six window. These windows have also been covered with particleboard.

### Southeast/Rear Elevation

The back of the building is blank. It faces a small stone privy that was built for the station's customers. The privy is a contributing resource to the nomination.

#### Summary

The Troy Lasater Service Station is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places with local significance under Criterion C for its English Revival style. Constructed in 1935 the building served New Blaine as a Service Station into the 1940s, but declined with the rest of the town and was closed relatively soon after it was opened. The building is also being nominated under Criterion A for its association with travel and commerce in New Blaine. The Troy Lasater Service Station is being submitted to the National Register of Historic Places under the multiple property listing, "Historic and Architectural Resources of New Blaine, Arkansas, 1920-1940".

### Elaboration

The Troy Lasater Service Station was constructed in 1935 by Freeborn and Troy Lasater. The service station was located close to the Lasater's new home and was built for their son Troy to operate. The pit where the gas tank is located was hand dug by local men for a fee of fifty-cents each a day. The station was a onepump station, with Texaco being the primary gasoline provider.

With the economic downturn of the Great Depression tightening its grip, the Lasater family left New Blaine for California. "Rattlesnake" Pete Bradley then operated the station. By the early 1940s New Blaine's economy had dried up and the station was closed for good.

When Mary Gehring purchased the property in the late 1970s it was in terrible condition. Fortunately she was able to repair the roof and replace the broken out windows with historically accurate replacements. Unfortunately, vandals kept breaking window and Mrs. Gehring was forced to cover them with particleboard to protect them from destruction.

### Statement of Significance

The Troy Lasater Service Station is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places with local significance under Criterion C as the best example of a English Revival style building in the community. Constructed in 1935 the building served New Blaine as a Service Station into the 1940s, but declined with the rest of the town and was closed relatively soon after it was opened. The property reflects the economic downfall of New Blaine, and thus is also being nominated under Criterion A for its association with travel and commerce in New Blaine. The Troy Lasater Service Station is being submitted to the National Register of Historic Places under the multiple property listing, "Historic and Architectural Resources of New Blaine, Arkansas, 1920-1940".






