Description:

The Womble District Administration House #1 is located just east of Mt. Ida on U.S. 270. The one and one-half story, rectangular, frame house rests upon a continuous stone base. The walls of the structure are covered with novelty siding and the structure is topped with a gable roof covered with composition shingles. The southern view of the building has a one bay central porch which is glass enclosed. On either side of the porch there are single six-over-six windows which have been covered with storm windows. The porch has a gabled roof covered with composition shingles which runs into the main gable of the house. The pediment over the porch features a louvered vent and board-and-batten siding. The eastern side of the building has three different types of six-over-six windows; two on the first level and one in the upper level, and all have been covered with storm windows. This side also has two ladders fastened to the wall. The northern side of the building has a rear "T" which is screened-in. This side of the structure has two six-over-six windows, evenly spaced. The structure has an interior, central chimney which is made of brick. The house is in good condition.

Also included in the nomination are a simple, gable roof automobile garage and a smaller, gable roof storage building, for a total of two buildings and one structure.

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The Womble District Administration House #1 was constructed circa 1940 by members of the 741st Company of the Arkansas CCC District stationed at the side camp of the main Crystal Springs Camp that was located at Black Springs, approximately ten miles southwest of Mt. Ida. It was constructed as the administrative headquarters for the Womble Ranger District of the Ouachita National Forest (ONF). This building constituted the district headquarters for this sizeable district, and it continues to serve that purpose today. As such, the Womble District Administration House #1 remains significant through its associations with the significant contributions to American social history made by the Civilian Conservation Corps and for its associations with the conservation movement that President Roosevelt intended this organization to serve, particularly within such protected federal lands as the national forests.
