The CCC Company 741 Powder Magazine Historic District consists of two small stone and concrete structures originally constructed to store powder and blasting caps for use by the Civilian Conservation Corps working in the Ouachita National Forest.

Elaboration:

originally constructed to store powder and blasting caps for use by the Civilian Conservation Corps working in the Ouachita National Forest.

The powder magazine is the larger of the two buildings. It sits just north of Forest Service Road 177M 113 meters southeast of the smaller blasting cap magazine. It is a rectangular structure building measuring about sixteen feet long on its northeast and southwest sides and eight feet on the northeast and southwest sides. The powder magazine is about five feet high with a four-inch thick concrete top and a concrete floor. The cut-stone and concrete walls are about one foot thick. There is a door in the southwest façade of the structure. The structure is in good condition.

The blasting cap magazine is the smaller of the two buildings. It sits just north of Forest Service Road 177M 113 meters northwest of the larger powder magazine. It is a square structure building measuring about ten feet long on each side. The blasting cap magazine is about five feet high with a four-inch thick concrete top and a concrete floor. The cut-stone and concrete walls are about one foot thick. There is a door in the southwest façade of the structure. The structure is in good condition.

tivilian Conservation Corps Company 741, the oldest CCC company in the Arkansas District, was formed on May 1, 1933, at Camp Pike, Arkansas, and moved to Crystal Springs Camp on May 17, 1933. Four side camps were established from the Crystal Springs Camp, including Crystal Valley Camp near Norman, which the nominated structures were constructed to serve, probably ca. 1936. The company constructed the nominated powder magazine and blasting cap magazine to store explosives for use on road and bridge construction or for other such conservation projects within the Ouachita National Forest.

Though they are of simple, functional design, the structures in the Civilian Conservation Corps Company 741 Powder Magazine Historic District remain significant by virtue of their association with the contributions to American social history made by the CCC and through their associations with the emphasis on conservation that comprised the original mandate of the CCC. They also are notable for their connection to Company 741, the earliest CCC company established in the state. They are thus eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion A with local significance within the historic context "Facilities Constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps in Arkansas, 1933-1942."
