DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

In 1891 the Women's Library Association of Helena, Arkansas, constructed a two-and-one-half storey building to house their library. Almost forty years later a one-and-one-half-storey museum was added to the original library building. The combined structures are known as the Helena Library and Museum.

The library is a two-storey brick building with a mansard roof. Paired gable dormers project from the roof on all four elevations. On the side and rear elevations the double-hung sash windows have segmental heads and cast-stone lugsills. Around the entire building the wall surface is broken with coursing at the second-storey line.


The facade of the library is divided into three bays by brick pilasters. Paired windows set in segmental-arch frames flank the one-storey enclosed entry porch. An unusual decorated entablature surmounts the second-storey windows on the facade. The cornice features molded woodwork with decorative brackets above brick coursing.

The museum building adjoins the southwest corner of the library and is architecturally harmonious with the library building. Like the library, the facade of the museum is divided into three bays by brick pilasters and has a segmental—arch entry flanked by paired, segmental—arch windows. The museum has a truncated hip roof extending over the brick cornice.

Several additions have been made to the rear of the Helena Library and Museum. In the 1960's two one-storey, flat-roofed additions were made to the rear (west) elevation of the library. A one-storey, gable-roofed extension was added to the museum in 1974. The only alteration to the library's facade occurred about 1914 when the entry was moved from the north front window to the center bay.

The interior of the library building has molded trim with corner blocks around doors and windows. In the northeast corner of the building an elegant stairway with slender turned balusters rises to the second storey. The interior of the museum consists of one large open room completely surrounded by a railed balcony. Museum displays are located around both the ground floor and the balcony. Interior woodwork in the museum is harmonious with that in the library.

This architecturally interesting structure, which is somewhat reminiscent of the Second-Empire style, is painted a glowing pink with white trim around the doors and windows. Resting on its original site near the downtown area, the Helena Library and Museum remains in excellent condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

As the oldest public building in Helena, Arkansas, the Phillips County Library and Museum is an important local landmark. During the two decades following its 1891 construction the building functioned as the civic center of Helena. Its continual use as a library and museum has made it the most historically important educational building still standing in Phillips County.

In the 1870's Helena's first library originated with the Rescue Hook and Ladder Company. This volunteer-firemen's group had a small lending library for several years. In 1878 another group of men established the Helena Library Association. Ten years later the Women's Library Association was organized and chartered, and the Helena Library Association soon disbanded. The 533 books owned by the men's library were donated to the new women's library.

Construction of a permenant library building was important to the Women's Library Association. In 1889, only a year after the group was organized, a site was acquired on which to build a library. By 1891 enough money had been raised to finance construction of a \$6,000.00 building. Helena contractors Raenhart and Simon were in charge of construction.

From 1889 until the 1920's, when public support first became available, almost every kind of money raising event imaginable was held to benefit the Helena Library. From the sale of local bonds and figurative bricks to the holding of benefit concerts, bazaars and dances, the Helena community was continually involved in raising money to support the library. Probably the most unusual fund-raising event occurred when the main hall of the library building was used as a skating rink.

As Helena's civic center around the turn of the century, the library was used for frequent dances, receptions and women's club meetings. Religious services and school classes were held there occasionally. It was not unitl 1914 that the main room of the building was devoted exclusively to library purposes.

Beginning in 1889, with the donation of a carved wooden inkwell, many museum items were donated to the Helena Library. Through the years more and more artifacts were presented to the library, and with each new gift the need for a museum building grew. After a number of years of fund

raising similar to that which financed the library, a museum wing was added to the Helena Library in 1929.

The Helena Museum is one of the most important local museums in Arkansas. Displays include Indian artifacts, personal effects of several individuals prominent in Helena's history, Civil War relics, early documents relating to Phillips County history and many other items. In addition, both the museum and library contain a great deal of archival material concerned with Helena's past.

Architecturally, the Helena Library and Museum is unusual in eastern Arkansas because of its mansard roof. In this community of Greek Revival and Victorian residences, the French mansard library is a distinctive change of pace. For many years the building has been painted a vibrant pink, a color in contrast to the quiet use of the structure.


The Helena Library and Museum has a great deal of local historic significance as the oldest public building in the community, as an early civic center, and as the repository for a great number of articles and information concerned with Phillips County history. Its architectural style, unusual in this area, adds further to the signficance of the building.


