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## Description

The Gemmill-Faust House (at 321 St. Andrew's Terrace) is a two-and-one-half story, wood frame and brick masonry residence designed in the Prairie style. Dominated by the broad, spreading eaves of the main hipped roof and surmounting hipped dormer, the house includes such other characteristic features as the light colored brick, the straight, square brick columns that support the flat roof front porch, the flat roof on both the northern porte cochere and the southern sun room, the ribbon window configurations on virtually all elevations, and the multi-pane clear glass windows throughout. An assortment of window and door types are also employed. Two brick chimneys — one adjacent to the northern wall and the other rising near the intersection of the northern and western slopes of the hipped roof — vent the interior. The asphalt shingle roof and brick walls rest upon a continuous brick foundation, covered with stucco to resemble stone.

Also included in the nomination is an original, single-story, hipped roof brick garage building located directly to the west or rear of the main house. It contains a single brick chimney rising from the center of the structure. It is contributing.

## Significance

Criterion C, local significance

The Gemmill-Faust House (at 321 St. Andrew's Terrace) is locally significant under Criterion C by virtue of its status as the best example of a pure Prairie style house in West Helena. Constructed just south of the ninety-degree turn at the eastern end of Plaza Avenue in one of the residential areas of the city developed slightly later than those sections immediately to the west, it is associated with the historic context Historic Resources of West Helena, Arkansas, 1900-1945 as one of the few surviving historic homes with any degree of integrity, and as the best known extant example of this popular national architectural style.

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Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the western edge of St. Andrew's Terrace with a perpendicular line running parallel with the building's southern elevation and located approximately 50 feet to the south thereof, proceed westerly along said line for approximately 300 feet; thence proceed northerly along a perpendicular line for approximately 200 feet; thence proceed easterly along a perpendicular line for approximately 300 feet to its intersection with the western edge of St. Andrew's Terrace; thence proceed southerly along said edge to the point of beginning.
