Beginning at a point located approximately 200 feet south of a point on the southern edge of Forest Service Road #106 located approximately 3,000 feet southeast of Bench Mark 1323.3, proceed easterly along a line running parallel to the dam's northern elevation for a distance of 200 feet; thence proceed southerly along a line running perpendicular to the dam's principal direction for a distance of 200 feet; thence proceed westerly along a line running parallel with the dam's southern elevation for a distance of 200 feet; thence proceed northerly along a line running perpendicular to the dam's principal direction for a distance of 200 feet to the point of beginning.

Description:


The Bard Springs Recreation Area is located on Forest Service Road 106 along Blaylock Creek between Blaylock Mountain and Raspberry Mountains in the Cossatot Mountains of Polk County. The Recreation Area has two dams which help to form a horseshoe bend on Blaylock Creek which is the primary water source for the Recreation Area. Dam No. 2 is on the eastern side of the recreation area and is constructed of cut stone. The dam is approx 75 ft. in length and approx 15 ft. in height. The dam has steps on either side of the creek which serve as a footing for the dam, and are square in shape. The main body of the dam has one continuous spillway which drops the water onto a series of staggered steps reducing the water eroding force on the creek at the base of the dam. In the center of the dam is a shut off valve which connects to a pipe in the lower portion of the dam to control the water elevation in the recreation area.



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The Bard Springs Dam #2 was constructed circa 1936 by members of the 742nd Company of the Arkansas CCC District stationed at the Mena Camp that was located approximately eight miles to the northwest, near the small town of Shady. It was constructed as part of a small, public recreational complex within the Ouachita National Forest (ONF) as a result of the CCC's emphasis upon recreational construction that began in earnest circa 1935. The extant historic structures within this complex include this dam, another dam, a bathhouse and a picnic shelter (each of which is nominated separately), all of which allowed the area to function purely as a swimming and picnicking facility, as it continues to do today. As such, the Bard Springs Dam #2 remains significant through its associations with the contributions to American social history made by the Civilian Conservation Corps, its associations with the emphasis upon outdoor recreation that guided such construction, and its status as an excellent example of CCC recreational architecture in a remarkable state of preservation.






ROAD LEGEND
