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## **Description:**

The Bard Springs Recreation Area is located on Forest Service Road 106 on Blaylock Creek between Blaylock Mountain and Raspberry Mountain in the Cossatot Mountains in Polk County. The picnic shelter is a single story, open air structure set on a continuous stone foundation. The structure has a large gabled roof covered with composition shingles which is supported by four large columns on both the north and south sides of the structure. The columns which support the roof are set in square concrete blocks for support. The structure is in good condition. United States Department of the Interior National Park Service

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The Bard Springs Picnic Shelter was constructed circa 1936 by members of the 742nd Company of the Arkansas CCC District stationed at the Mena Camp that was located approximately eight miles to the northwest, near the small town of Shady. It was constructed as part of a small, public recreational complex within the Ouachita National Forest (ONF) as a result of the CCC's emphasis upon recreational construction that began in earnest circa 1935. The extant historic structures within this complex include this picnic shelter, a bathhouse, and two dams (each of which is nominated separately), all of which allowed the area to function purely as a swimming and picnicking facility, as it continues to do today. As such, the Bard Springs Picnic Shelter remains significant through its associations with the emphasis upon outdoor recreation that guided such construction, and its status as an excellent example of CCC recreational architecture in a remarkable state of preservation.
