#### Description:


The Shady Lake Recreation Area is located on Forest Service Road No. 38 in Polk County. A unique structure at the recreation area is the bathhouse. The bathhouse is an irregularly-shaped single story structure constructed of logs and novelty siding, resting upon a continuous concrete block foundation. The structure is constructed in three sections which are connected with short covered walkways. Each of the end buildings are used as male and female changing rooms. The middle section serves as a concession and picnic area. The restrooms have louvered windows and the rear of the middle section has six-over-six windows. Each section of the structure has a gable roofcovered with composition shingles.

The Shady Lake Bathhouse was constructed circa 1940 by members of the 742nd Company of the Arkansas CCC District stationed at the Mena Camp that was located approximately eight miles to the northeast, near the small town of Shady. It was constructed as part of a small, public recreational complex within the Ouachita National Forest (ONF) as a result of the CCC's emphasis upon recreational construction that began in earnest circa 1935. The extant historic structures within this complex include this bathhouse, a picnic pavillion, a caretaker's house, and a dam (each of which is nominated separately), all of which allowed the area to function purely as a swimming and picnicking facility, as it continues to do today. As such, the Shady Lake Bathhouse remains significant through its associations with the contributions to American social history made by the Civilian Conservation Corps, its associations with the emphasis upon outdoor recreation that guided such construction, and its status as an excellent example of CCC recreational architecture in a remarkable state of preservation.
