Physical Description

The imegularity and vertically oriented massing of this imposing two-story house are reminiscent of Victorian domestic architecture, while its classical details reflect the then burgeoning Colonial Revival style. The large, rambling house faced with weatherboard siding rises well above street level sited on a berm, and is elevated further on a high brick foundation. From a shallow hipped roof rectangular block project two cross gable wings on the front elevation. Contributing to the verticality is the use of long, narrow sash windows (of two-over-two-lights) throughout the house. The wide front porch which wraps around the north side elevation contributes a strong opposing horizontal line. A bay window enlivens the front elevation on the foremost projecting block. The Classical Revival details on this porch include urn-shaped balusters, Tuscan columns raised on brick plinths which support a full entablature embellished with modillion blocks underlining the cornice. At the porch entrance the columns are paired and the porch recesses on the south end, corresponding to the massing of the house. The double leaf door features an arched transom.

Statement of Significance

Located on one of the largest lots in the downtown Little Rock residential area, the Mehaffey House is a striking two-story home. The house was designed ca. 1905 by architect Charles L. Thompson. It is a good example of a design with lingering Victorian elements coupled with newer, more fashionable Colonial Revival decorative details. The large house features a wide porch which wraps around the east and north elevations and is supported by Tuscan columns. Irregular and vertical massing is reminiscent of Victorian styling. One of the more imposing historic homes in its neighborhood, the Mehaffey House appears much the same as in the original drawing.
