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Description:

Just south of the Dry Creek Wilderness Area at the junction of County Roads #96 and #99 in northeast Scott County is a small powder magazine. The structure is approx 50 meters (164 ft.) south of the road junction on a ridge overlooking Dutch Creek. The structure is constructed of cut stone and concrete in a simple form roughly 4 ft. wide and 3 ft. in length at its base and ranges in height from 3 ft. on the southern side to 4 1/2 ft. tall on its northern side. The only significant feature of the structure is an opening on the southern side which is roughly 3 ft. tall and 18 inches wide. The southern portion of the structure is the only side showing decay with several stones having been knocked out of place. The roof is a shed type sloping to the south. The structure is in generally good shape.



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The Powder Magazine was constructed circa 1935 by members of the 1707th Company of the Arkansas CCC District stationed at the Waldron Camp that was located close nearby. It was constructed for the storage of explosives that were commonly used for road and bridge construction, and for other such conservation projects as erosion control within the Ouachita National Forest (ONF). Though of simple, functional design, the Powder Magazine remains significant through its associations with the contributions to American social history made by the Civilian Conservation Corps and through its associations with the emphasis upon conservation that comprised the original mandate for the CCC.
