Describe present and historic physical appearance:



The Square Rock Dipping Vat is a concrete structure with an associated dripping platform located northeast of the junctions of Forest Service Road 296 and 565A in the Ouachita National Forest. It is flanked to the northeast by a four-strand barbed-wire holding pen of indeterminate age. The Square Rock Dipping Vat is in good condition, with only slight signs of deterioration in its walls.

ELABORATION

The Square Rock Dipping Vat is a concrete structure with an associated dripping platform located northeast of the junctions of Forest Service Road 296 and 565A in the Ouachita National Forest. It is flanked to the northeast by a four-strand barbed-wire holding pen of indeterminate age. The Square Rock Dipping Vat is in good condition, with only slight signs of deterioration in its walls.

The structure is oriented roughly east to west and includes a concrete dipping vat terminating on its west end in a raised masonry dripping pad for recovering cattle-dip solution. The overall length of the vat and pad is approximately 13 meters. The vat is about one meter wide and is about six feet deep.

The vat's south wall has several names etched into the concrete, but due to weathering of the concrete they are virtually exhausted. Words etched appear to read: Ballard, C.W. Garner, Sec 32 and ALP.

The Square Rock Dipping Vat is in good condition, with all of its walls intact with minimal signs of collapse, thus meeting the registration requirements of the multiple-property listing Dip That Tick: Texas Tick Fever Eradication in Arkansas, 1907-1943. The property has excellent integrity of location, remaining at its original site within deep forest in Scott County, Arkansas, a location that also provides it with integrity of setting, feeling and association. It has good integrity of design, augmented by the barbed-wire holding pen at its east end, and its continued high degree of structural integrity is proof of its workmanship, and none of its original materials have been compromised.

SUMMARY:

The Square Rock Dipping Vat is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion A with local significance by virtue of its status as an intact concrete structure erected as part of the government effort to eradicate Texas tick fever from Arkansas cattle.

ELABORATION:

Early homesteaders of Section 32, Township 4 North, Range 28 West where the nominated property is located included William H. Gregory who bought 40 acres on June 30, 1884, Henry Litreal who acquired 160 acres on eptember 19, 1898, and John Wagner, who bought 160 acres on February 27, 1901. It is unknown who owned the land at the time of the Square Rock Dipping Vat's construction

The Square Rock Dipping Vat is believed to have been constructed around 1920 to serve families in the remote area of what is now the Ouachita National Forest in which the vat is located. The vat is typical in design to most of its kind, with a straight run terminating in a drip pad. It likely was in use until the Texas fever quarantine was lifted from Arkansas in 1943. It is noteworthy today as the most intact known cattle dipping vat in its area of Scott County and as such remains a tangible link with efforts to protect Arkansas cattle herds from the scourge of Texas fever.

The Square Rock Dipping Vat is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion A with local significance by virtue of its status as an intact concrete structure erected as part of the government effort to eradicate Texas tick fever from Arkansas.

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


