#### Summary

Located on the north side of U.S. Highway 62/63 near the eastern boundary of the present Hardy city limits, the Web Long House is a single-story flagstone house constructed in 1943. The essentially rectangular plan residence is covered by a composition-shingle, side-gable roof. There are no chimneys. A projecting gable to the east is clad with asbestos plate siding and originally served as the office for the motel. There are two structures that comprise the motel: a side gable roof flagstone duplex to the east of the house and a long rectangular-plan, flat roof, flagstone building that is to the east and perpendicular to the house and duplex.

#### Elaboration

The front, or southern, elevation of the house is fenestrated by three sixover-six wood windows. A single-leaf entrance is positioned to the west of the easternmost window. It features a raised concrete stoop with stairs on both the east and west approaches. A solid fieldstone balustrade provides a handrail and conceals the stairs and stoop when viewed from the south. A small, cantilevered gable roof shields the stoop.

The eastern elevation contains the projecting-gable office bay. It features a single-leaf entrance protected by a metal awning and a large sixteen-pane, metal-frame casement window on the southern elevation. The bay is positioned to the north of the end of the main house, and a concrete stair and stoop built to the south of the office is flush with the southern elevation wall of the main house. The actual eastern elevation of the office bay contains an identical casement window. The northern elevation of the office, which is inderneath a carport, contains a six-pane, metal-frame casement window and a

single leaf entrance.

The northern elevation of the house is composed of a carport on either side f a small wood-frame room in the center of the facade. The carport is created by a longer and shallower-pitched rear half of the side gable roof. It is supported by eight simple wood posts. There are three windows on the rear wall of the main house and three windows and a door on the frame room.

The western elevation is composed of two six-over-six windows. All of the gable ends are sheathed with vertical pine siding, and the two main gables have wood louvered attic vents.

The interior of the main house is divided by a central hall extending east and west. To the south is the living room and two bedrooms, while the dining room, kitchen, bathroom and bedroom are north of the hall. The original oak flooring has been covered by a combination of shag, indoor/outdoor and tile carpeting. The interior walls are clad with both knotty pine paneling and drywall. All of the ceilings are knotty pine with the exception of the former office, now used as a den, which has ceiling tiles.

To the east of the house is a small, flagstone duplex covered by a composition-shingle, side gable roof. The front, or southern, elevation contains two single-leaf entrances with storm doors and a large concrete patio. The eastern elevation has one six-over-six wood window with an air conditioner. The roof eave of the rear elevation is nearly level with the ground behind the duplex due to the slope of the hill. A concrete retaining wall allows a full height wall with two six-over-six windows. The western elevation also has two windows, but one of the six-over-six windows has been eplaced with a one-over-one window. Gable end treatment matches that of the house. This structure was probably originally rented as part of the motel; it now appears to be used for storage.

The rectangular-plan motel is located to the east of the duplex and is oriented north/south with the front elevation facing west. This flagstone structure has a flat roof that is slightly sloped to the east. The motel is divided into four units, and the front elevation consists of four single-leaf entrances and four metal-frame casement windows. The east elevation is lighted by just three small casement windows. The solitary window opening on the south elevation, which faces the highway, now contains a window-unit air conditioner. The motel is no longer used for boarding travelers and tourists, but is being rented for apartment/studio space.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and period of significance noted above:

The Web Long House was built in 1943 for Web and Juanita Long for a threefold purpose. First, it served as a home for the four members of the family; secondly, it served as real estate office; and, thirdly, the 20' by 40' room on the east side served as an office for the motel that was built about the same time. Web Long was President of the Hardy Development Council which was very important to the development of Hardy during the 1950s. Another owner, Glen Roberts, was mayor of Hardy for many years. His widow, Darlene Roberts, presently owns the property.

The Web Long House and Motel is being nominated as part of the "Historic and Architectural Resources of Hardy" multiple-property nomination under Criterion C with local significance. The house is an excellent example of the transition period from the Minimal Traditional houses of the 1930s and 1940s and the Ranch-style residences of the 1950s. The motel is also significant for being one of the first true motels, as opposed to individual tourist court cabins, in Sharp County.






