Description

During the Railroad Era (1870-1914) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period, however, are somewhat limited. The Jim Little House is a good example of a one-story T-shaped building that is of frame construction clad with novelty siding and has a gable roof. The roof is covered with composition shingles and the entire structure rests on stone piers.

Located on the north side of Walnut Street between S.E. Front and Second Streets, this building was constructed less than two blocks northeast of Bradford's Missouri-Pacific Railroad Depot. The Jim Little House was constructed c. 1895, and is in good condition. Its main, or south, elevation is dominated by a shed roof porch that extends across most of the facade. The porch roof is supported by turned posts that are adorned with decorative wooden brackets. Two doors enter the porch. A brick chimney rises from the gable peak between these two doors.

Fenestration of the main, east and west elevations of the structure consists of single symmetrically placed one-over-one double-hung sash windows. The window on the north elevation of the original building has been replaced by a smaller two-over-two double-hung aluminum sash window. Corner boards are found on all edges of the house. Porches originally flanked the protruding northern portion of the structure; they have both been enclosed. The western porch has been covered with processed wood board. Its west side is relieved by a single door and an asymmetrically placed four-over-four double-hung aluminum sash window. A similar, although symmetrically placed, window is found on the north elevation of this porch. The enclosed porch on the east elevation of the house is clad with novelty siding. Fenestration exists only on the east elevation of the former porch. It originally consisted of symmetrically placed one-over-one double-hung sash windows; the northernmost window, however, has been replaced with smaller one-over-one double-hung aluminum sash. A single door is located south of these two windows.

Significance

When this house was constructed, c. 1895, it was one of numerous T-shaped buildings built during the Railroad Era (1870-1914). Though there are eighty-three of these buildings still left in the county, few exhibit the amount of integrity found in the Jim Little House. For this reason it is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance.
