The Howard O'Neal Barn is a two-story, wood frame animal/equipment/feed agricultural building. It retains a rectangular, symmetrical transverse crib plan. It is supported by a foundation of stone piers and its vertical board wall sheathing is protected by a metal gambrel roof with flared eaves.

The western or main elevation is relieved only by a large, central vehicular entry that is surmounted by a pedimented, projecting hay hood above another rectangular opening on the second floor. The eastern elevation is relieved only by the central entrance on the first floor. The northern and southern elevations are blank.

Its interior consists of three pens to the north of the runway and four to the south. A low ceiling on the first floor allows for a taller hay loft above.

Significance

Criterion C, local significance

Built by Otto Roetzel c. 1938, the Howard O'Neal Barn is significant as the best example in the county from this era of White County history (Boom and Bust: The War and Depression Years, 1914-1939; Section E,4) of a pure transverse crib barn constructed on the smaller scale that was found far more often among barns of this era. Many farmers required only a relatively small facility for the small farms that predominated during the Depression. This structure stands as an especially well-preserved example of this type. It is in good condition.




#### Verbal Boundary Description:


Beginning at the point formed by the intersection of a line running parallel to the barn's western elevation and located 50 feet to the west thereof with a perpendicular line running parallel to the barn's northern elevation and located 50 feet to the north thereof (located 250 feet east of County Road 73 and 637 feet north of County Road 238), proceed easterly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the eastern elevation; thence proceed southerly for a distance of approximately 200 feet along said line to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the southern elevation; thence proceed westerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the western elevation; thence proceed northerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to the point of beginning.

#### **Boundary Justification:**

This resource was constructed as part of a larger farmstead that has lost its integrity as such; thus, this boundary includes all the property known to be historically associated with this resource.
