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The Martindale Corn Crib is a single story, wood frame (post and nailers) corn storage building. It features a rectangular, single pen plan. Its plank walls are supported by stone piers and covered with a metal gable roof.

The eastern elevation is accessed by a single-leaf, central door flanked by two rectangular window openings. Below each window is a horizontal, hinged shutter. All three other elevations are blank.

The interior is an unfinished single pen with its post and nailer construction exposed.

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Significance Criterion C, local significance

The Martindale Corn Crib is significant as the best example in the county from this era of White County history (Boom and Bust: The War and Depression Years, 1914-1939; Section E,4) of a gable roof, rectangular storage building that is constructed with posts and nailers. This building technique employs a minimum of vertical studs on each wall, with the studs being connected by a single horizontal "nailer" placed half-way up the wall that serves to provide additional stability to the vertical planks that constitute the exterior sheathing. The result is a construction method particularly well-suited to agricultural buildings that is both financially and structurally economical.

The Martindale Corn Crib is in good condition.

Verbal Boundary Description:

Beginning at the point formed by the intersection of a line running parallel to the northern elevation of the corn crib and located 50 feet to the north there with a perpendicular line running parallel to the western elevation of the corn crib and located 50 feet to the west thereof (located 75 feet south of the southern edge of State Highway 210 and 3,160 feet northwest of Bench Mark #274), proceed southerly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the southern elevation of the corn crib; thence proceed easterly for a distance of approximately 100 feet along said line to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the eastern elevation of the corn crib; thence proceed northerly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the northern elevation of the corn crib; thence proceed northerly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the northern elevation of the corn crib; thence proceed westerly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the northern elevation of the corn crib; thence proceed westerly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to the point of beginning.

Boundary Justification:

This resource was constructed as part of a larger farmstead that has lost its integrity as such; thus, this boundary includes all the property known to be historically associated with this resource.
