The chicken house at the E.D. Maddox Farm is a single story, wood frame animal shelter. It features a rectangular plan, is supported by a continuous, cast concrete foundation and covered with a metal gable roof.

The western elevation contains the sole entrance into the building. It is placed just to the south of center, covered with a shed roof supported on brackets and surrounded by the novelty-sided wall. The northern elevation is also sheathed with novelty siding and lighted with a row of window openings that can be closed through the use of a horizontal wood "shutter" hinged at the top. The eastern elevation is blank, and the southern elevation is lighted with four six-over-six wood sash windows set into the distinctive, diagonally-framed wall. Two small chutes are placed at grade between the windows to the west.

The interior is also constructed from the diagonal framing seen on the southern elevation and divided into four rooms of chicken perches and one open room that is accessed by the western entrance. Doors lead into each of the perch rooms.

The most extraordinary feature of the entire building is the unique diagonal framing between the wood studs, inside and out. It is used for walls, doors and partitions to create a structure that is as visually dynamic as it is functional.

Significance

Criterion C, local significance

The chicken house at the E.D. Maddox farm is significant by virtue of the extraordinary, open diagonal framing employed throughout the interior and one of the exterior elevations. This open design provided continuous ventilation for the chickens within and allowed for the more rapid dissipation of the odor from the manure. The selection of diagonal framing to accomplish this, however, especially considering all the mitering required, was certainly an attempt on the part of the builder to lend greater visual interest to an otherwise common farm structure. This chicken house stands as the only example of such construction and design from this era of White County history (Boom and Bust: The War and Depression Years, 1914-1939; Section E,4) in the entire county. It is in good condition.

Verbal Boundary Description:

Beginning at the point formed by the intersection of the western edge of County Road 36 with a perpendicular line running parallel to the northern elevation of the chicken house and located approximately 50 feet to the north thereof, proceed westerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the western elevation of the chicken house; thence proceed southerly for a distance of approximately 200 feet along said line to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the southern elevation of the chicken house; thence proceed easterly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running along the western edge of County Road 36; thence proceeding northerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to the point of beginning.

Boundary Justification:

This resource was constructed as part of a larger farmstead that has lost its integrity as such; thus, this boundary includes all the property known to be historically associated with this resource.
