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Description

During the Railroad Era (1870-1914) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period, however, are somewhat limited. The A.J. Smith House is a good example of a two-story, T-shaped building that is of frame construction and clad with weatherboard. The gable roof is covered with composition shingles and the entire structure rests on brick piers.

Located on the east side of State Road 385 and less than one-half mile north of the intersection of State Roads 385 and 11, this building was constructed within the Griffithville city limits. The A.J. Smith House was constructed c. 1887 and is still in good condition. Its main, or west, elevation is dominated by a one-story porch that wraps around all three sides of the "T". The shed roof is supported by wooden box columns that are decorated with simple capitals. Single wooden doors enter the porch from the west elevation of the original building as well as from its southern elevation. The upper portions of all three original gable ends are adorned with returns while the ground floor of the original building has been clad with diagonally arranged dimensional lumber.

The fenestration found on both floors of the original structure consists of either single or pair symmetrically placed, one-over-one double-hung wood sash windows. A single brick chimney rises from the northern slope of the original gable roof.

All additions to this house are located on the eastern elevation of the building. The largest has a hipped roof, extends the full length of this elevation and is one-story in height. Fenestration consists of three one-over-one double-hung ribbon windows located on the south side of this addition; they are asymmetrically placed. The opposite side of this room has a single centrally placed one-over-one double-hung sash window. A shed roof screened porch is attached to the southeast portion of this addition. A smaller shed roof addition runs from the northern side of the screened porch to the end of the hipped roof addition. It is fenestrated with both single and ribbon windows that both consist of one-over-one double-hung aluminum sash.

Another one-story shed roof addition is attached to the northern portion of both the previously mentioned addition and the hipped roof addition. It is relieved only by a pair of centrally placed four-pane fixed frame windows found on its north elevation.

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Significance

When this house was constructed, c. 1887, it was one of numerous T-shaped buildings built during the Railroad Era (1870-1914). Even though there are eighty-four of these buildings still left in the county very few exhibit the amount of integrity found in the A.J. Smith House. For this reason it is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance.






All of Block 2, I.R. Pence Addition to the Town of Griffithville.
