Description

Commercial buildings of the Railroad Era (1870-1914) mirrored current architectural trends. Builders during this period in White County did not construct many high-style buildings; they instead used architectural details from these styles to elaborate their basically vernacular buildings. The Powell Clothing Store in Beebe is no exception to this.

Located on the west corner of W. Illinois and N. Main Streets, this building is located in what was once the economic heart of Beebe. The building is two-stories tall, rectangular in shape, and constructed of brick. Even though it was built c. 1885, it is still in good condition. The storefront windows along Main St. have been replaced by single-pane fixed frame windows and the transoms have been covered up while the windows facing Illinois have been covered up with aluminum. An awning which extends the length of the facade is the only other modern alteration to the ground floor. All second-story windows of the facade, except one, have been covered up with aluminum. The lone exception has been filled in with bricks. Above these windows are seven recessed panels highlighted with brick corbelling. The building has a flat with parapet roof which has a simple corbelled cornice.

Significance

When this building was constructed, c. 1885, it was one of numerous businesses located along Main St. This street runs perpendicular to the Missouri-Pacific Railroad tracks and in fact crosses them near the depot. Because of its proximity to this beehive of activity, many businesses located on Main St. Architecturally, the Powell Clothing Store is a good example of buildings constructed during this period. Also, it is one of only eleven relatively unaltered Railroad Era commercial buildings which survives in town.

Throughout the years, this building has housed a number of businesses including a grocer and druggist as well as a general store. As of 1924, its upper floor even housed a fraternal organization's lodge.
