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## National Register of Historic Places Continuation Sheet

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### Description

Located in the middle of a field in the small White County town of McRae, this jail is still in good condition, although it hasn't been in use for several years. It is a one-story, one-room building constructed of reinforced cast concrete, with a concrete block foundation and a flat concrete roof. In the center of the front elevation is a steel door with a small, barred opening; there are two other extremely small, barred openings serving as windows on the two side elevations.

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### Significance

As one of only three White County jails built by WPA labor, the McRae jail is in the best condition of the three, and is significant because of its associations with the community's government and civic functions following its August, 1934 construction. [See the associated property type for Religious and Institutional Buildings, Depression Era]. The structure is also representative of the attempts for economic survival and the general way of life that characterized the Depression era in McRae. It is therefore being considered for nomination under National Register Criterion A with local significance.

The small town of McRae, which was organized in the late 1890's, based its economy on the railroad, as did most other White County towns [See Historic Context 2: The Railroad Era]. The chief occupations in the town were railroading and sawmilling, with a box factory and several other woodworking plants among the major industries. The 1920's strawberry boom was a boost to the town's economy as well as its population, which peaked at about 1200 before the onset of the Depression.

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### Verbal Boundary Description:

Beginning at the point formed by the intersection of the northeastern edge of the adjacent unnamed alley with a perpendicular line running parallel to the northwestern elevation of the jail and located 50 feet to the northwest thereof; proceed northeasterly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the northeastern elevation of the jail; thence proceed southeasterly for a distance of approximately 100 feet along said line to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the southeastern elevation of the jail; thence proceed southwesterly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the southeastern elevation of the jail; thence proceed southwesterly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the southeastern elevation of the jail; thence proceed southwesterly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running along the northeastern edge of the adjacent alley; thence proceed northwesterly along said line for a distance of approximately 100 feet to the point of beginning.

### **Boundary Justification:**

The original lot has been subdivided during the non-historic period, resulting in an indefinite current lot boundary; therefore, this boundary includes all the property historically associated with this resource that retains its integrity.
