Description

The Fred Hall House is a single story, wood frame Craftsman residence. Its asymmetrically-placed front porch and gabled wall dormers obscure the front gable, rectangular plan. Two small interior fieldstone chimneys project from alternate sides of the main gable toward the rear of the house, while a massive fieldstone fireplace abuts the front wall of the house, beneath the porch. The roof is covered with composition shingles, the walls are clad with cut stone and imbricated shingles, and the continuous foundation is built of stone.

The southern or front elevation features a lower, gable roof porch to the west of the main, gable end of the house. The porch shelters a slightly recessed porch and entrance. The porch is decorated with exposed rafters along its sides and with imbricated shingles in the pediment. It also features false beam ends attached to the sill which rests upon the sloping wood columns with stone pedestals. The main gable end of the house is also decorated with false beam ends along the comice and imbricated shingles in the pediment. Beneath the porch, two four-over-one wood sash windows flank the stone chimney and a pair of the same light the wall to the east of the projecting porch. The cross-gable roof line and the resulting gabled wall domers render each elevation virtually identical. This similarity is underscored by the fact that the fenestration on each elevation, particularly the eastern and western, is also almost exactly the same. Even the northern or rear hipped roof screened porch features a central entry and ribbon windows on each side.

The Fred Hall House is virtually unaltered and intact; it is in good condition.

Significance

Criterion C, local significance

The Fred Hall House (Part E, Historic Context #4) is the best example in Kensett of a single story, wood frame, front gabled Craftsman style residence. Constructed in 1930, this house is typical of the third period in the evolution of Craftsman style designs in White County. Its floor plan has become very regular and symmetrical and features only the vestiges of the irregularity of plan and elevation which was one of the hallmark features of this building style.




