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Description

The Tom Watkins House is a two story, structural brick wall, Craftsman residence. The fundamentally rectangular plan of the gable roof main house block has been augmented with a wrap-around porch/carport and a rear gable roof ell and shed. Both brick chimneys are on the exterior of the house, the larger of the two being attached to the back of the main house block and the other on the gable end of the rear ell. The roof material is ceramic tile, the walls are brick, and the continuous foundation is formed from poured concrete.

The front or southern elevation features the shed roof, single story, brick wrap-around porch and carport at the southwest corner and the main block of the house to the east. The porch is supported on brick piers and features exposed rafters. The house roof displays exposed rafters also and is fenestrated with one-over-one wood sash windows and eight-pane casement windows.

The eastern elevation is fenestrated with a central group of eight-pane casement windows on each floor and those on the first floor are each surmounted by a pair of square panes. The western elevation is lighted with a pair of one-over-one wood sash windows beneath the porch on the first floor and a group of eight-pane casement windows on the upper story. The eaves are decorated with simple wood brackets.

The northern elevation is composed of the rear gable roof ell and the single story inserted shed. The elevation is fenestrated with a variety of multi-pane sash and casement windows and features an entry in the eastern end of the gable ell.

The Tom Watkins House is largely unaltered; it is in good condition.

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Significance

Criterion C, local significance

The Tom Watkins House (Part E, Historic Context #4), designed by Little Rock architect Charles L. Thompson, is the best example in Searcy of a two story, structural brick wall Craftsman style residence. It is typical of the early character of the Craftsman style in that there is a greater emphasis on the irregularity of both elevation and floor plan, and a concomitant emphasis upon quality materials and design to produce relatively sophisticated, ambitious, and informed architectural statements. Later the tendency toward picturesque, irregular compositions would trickle down to smaller commissions and designs if not the desire for the quality materials and expensive detail.


