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Description

The Dr. Emmett Snipes House is a one-and-one-half story, wood frame, gable-on-hip Folk Victorian residence. The projecting gable roof bays on the western, southern and eastern elevations and its original gable roof rear ell reveal its irregular plan. One brick chimney rises from the roof just behind the southern projecting gable and the other from behind the western projecting gable. The house is covered with a metal roof, is clad in both weatherboard and novelty siding, and rests upon brick piers.

The southern or main elevation is composed of the gable bay to the east, the wall with its entrance and surmounting doghouse dormer and decorated roof gable in the center, and the curved wall of the house to the west which is echoed by the circular form of the wrap-around spindlework porch; the side of the projecting western gable bay finishes the elevation. The eastern gable exhibits a pediment which is decorated with geometric stick detail around two small windows filled with false Gothic muntins, This pattern is echoed by the open stick detail set in front of the wall in the verge, A simple frieze below, divided into panels by vertical applied stick details, wraps around the gable and continues onto the eastern elevation toward the back of the house. A pair of newer aluminum windows are placed in the center of the first floor of the gable. The surviving moldings indicate that the original glazing was either a large, single pane below a row of smaller panes or a large, one-over-one wood sash window. To the west, a single entrance door and transom is accessed by a low staircase framed by a pedimented porch which projects from the shed roofed wrap-around porch. A one-over-one wood sash window lights the wall to the west of the entry, a single-pane fixed window lights the center of the curved wall, and another one-over-one wood sash window is placed in the western wall under the porch. The porch is supported on nine turned wood posts with pedestals and is decorated with the typical turned and sawn wood detail. The dormer above is filled with one-over-one wood sash,

The western elevation features the three-sided gabled bay in the center, with the curved, shed roof porch to the south and the later shed roof side addition to the north. The pediment of the gabled bay is decorated with simpler applied stick detail than seen on the front gable and is lighted with one fixed pane above three others. The original tall windows in the three facets of the bay below have been removed and the openings cut down to accommodate new multi-pane aluminum windows. The shed to the north also features a pair of new aluminum sash windows and an entry at the northern end covered by a simple metal awning. The original doghouse dormer is lighted with a single one-overone wood sash window.

The northern elevation also features the original gable roof ell in the center, separating the lower, shed roof screened porch to the west and the enclosed and screened shed to the east. The exposed plane created by the intersection of the gable and hipped roof forms above is decorated with simple, geometric stick detail. The pediment of the gable roof ell is filled with weatherboard and decorated below with the same frieze as seen on the southern elevation. The original window below has been replaced with a smaller multi-pane aluminum window. The enclosed portion of the shed to the east is fenestrated with a one-over-one wood sash window.

The eastern elevation is divided into three principal sections by the central, gable roof projection: to the south is a wall which is relieved only by a pair of one-over-one wood sash windows and to the north a screened shed roof porch has been added to an original rear room the two central

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windows of which have also been cut down and filled with new multi-pane aluminum windows. A six-over-six wood sash window completes the northern end of the elevation.

Spaces around the house between projecting elements which were originally intended to be left open have been filled with single story sheds of various purposes and several of the original windows have been removed and replaced with new aluminum windows. These alterations, though unfortunate, are chiefly confined to the rear of the house, and are not of such magnitude as to seriously compromise its historic integrity.

The Dr. Emmett Snipes House is in fair condition.

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<u>Significance</u>

Criterion C, local significance

The Dr. Emmett Snipes House (Part E, Historic Context #3) was constructed c. 1900 by Dr. Emmett Snipes, a local druggist and mayor of Searcy between 1894 and 1896. It is the best extant high-style example in Searcy of a one-and-one-half story, Folk Victorian residence. In spite of the removal of several of the original windows the house retains an abundance of the original detail and design qualities which identify it as a Folk Victorian design. In addition, its subtle infusion of such Colonial Revival elements as the pediment over the porch entry heralded the transition that was imminent for the Folk Victorian idiom as it began to incorporate Classical elements.
