
Physical Description

Sited on the outskirts of town in a pastoral setting, this one and one-half story frame house, constructed of cypress, with a steep gable end roof was designed around 1910. Its simple rectangular shape, the high foundation of brick piers and the sweeping lines of the roof which extend to cover a large wrap-around porch lend the picturesque effect of a raised southern cottage. The simple embellishments include Tuscan porch columns, two centrally located gable roof dormers with half-timbering effects, and fish-scale shingles on the gable ends and accenting the front dormer windows.

Statement of Significance


The Dean House in Portland, Arkansas, is located next door to the Pugh House (AS-003). Although these structures share the same spacious, lush, tree-shaded setting, they are a definite contrast of architectural design. The Dean House was constructed ca. 1910. Appropriate to its southern Arkansas setting, it is reminiscent of a raised southern cottage. This design is one of the more unique projects of the firm in its finished effect and remains unaltered from the original design. A large wrap-around porch supported by Tuscan columns is featured in the design. Fish-scale shingles dramatize the two front dormers. Of cypress construction, the house is marked by a large expanse of gable roof.
