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## **Description:**


The Crossett Experimental Forest Complex is located south of Crossett on Arkansas Highway 133 roughly one-and-one-half miles north of the Louisiana State line. Building No. 2 is a one-and-one-half story, rectangular, log structure set on a continuous, cast concrete foundation and topped with a gable roof covered with composition shingles. The eastern side has a series of four garage style doors set side-by-side. The northern side has two casement windows with six panes each on the first level as well as a six-pane casement window centered on the second level. The western side has no features other than its exterior log wall. The southern side has two casement windows on the first level and a small loft door in the second level. The structure has no chimney or porch and is in excellent condition.

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
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The Crossett Experimental Forest Building #2 was constructed circa 1939 by members of the 768th Company of the Arkansas CCC District stationed at the Oden Camp that was located at Oden, in northwestern Montgomery County, though it was later moved further northwest to Buck Knob. It was constructed as part of the administrative headquarters for the Southern Experimental Forest of the Ouachita National Forest (ONF). This building was the garage and vehicular maintenance building for the Experimental Forest, and it continues to serve that purpose today. As such, the Crossett Experimental Forest Building #2 remains significant through its associations with the significant contributions to American social history made by the Civilian Conservation Corps and for its associations with the conservation movement that President Roosevelt intended this organization to serve, particularly within such protected federal lands as the national forests.



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
