Summary:
The Sugar Creek Vista Overlook is an 84-foot long, 14-foot tall stone wall topped with 18 to 23 inches or rubblestone. Civilian Conservation Corps Company 742 built the structure in 1935.
Elaboration:
The Sugar Creek Vista Overlook is an 84-foot long, 14-foot tall stone wall topped with 18 to 23 inches of

blestone. Civilian Conservation Corps Company 742 built the structure in 1935.

Sugar Creek Vista Overlook provides a roadside pullout from Forest Service Road 38 within the Ouachita National Forest. It is built from quarried novaculite and sandstone rocks that are set with grapevine mortar. The overlook is located on the west side of the road and offers a scenic view of a valley that adjoins Dicks Gap.

The overlook is built in an angular design and is approximately 84 feet long from end to end. It tapers outward from the roadside and is about 14 feet tall in its center. The overlook is topped with rubblestone that was added at an unknown date.

The Sugar Creek Vista Overlook has excellent integrity. It is still in its original location, which gives it a high degree of integrity of setting, feeling and association. Its design and workmanship reflect the careful work of the Civilian Conservation Corps members who constructed it. Though the rubblestone wall that tops the overlook was added at a later date, replacing the original railing of large logs atop stone posts, it still reflects the natural materials that were the hallmark of the CCC.

The Sugar Creek Vista Overlook, built in 1935 by CCC Co. 742, is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion A for its association with the activities of the Civilian Conservation Corps in the Ouachita National Forest and under Criterion C with statewide significance as a rare and well-constructed example of a scenic overlook, one of only two known to have been built by the CCC in the Ouachita National Forest. The nomination is made within the historic context "Facilities Constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps in Arkansas, 1933-1942."

Elaboration:

Civilian Conservation Corps Company 741 was formed on May 1, 1933, at Camp Pike, Arkansas, and was the second company formed in the Arkansas District. The company moved to Section 33, Township 3 South, Range 29 West on May 18, 1933, and established its camp. The formal camp was built between June 15 and July 12, 1933.

The Official Annual Arkansas District Civilian Conservation Corps, Seventh Corps Area, published in 1937, noted that the company's accomplishments included 12,000 acres of timber stand improvement, four dams constructed (including Shady Lake Dam, NR 10/20/93), two forest camp grounds constructed (containing Shady Lake Bathhouse, Shady Lake Caretaker's House and Shady Lake Picnic Pavilion, NR 10/20/93), sixty miles of telephone lines built and maintained, thousands of man-days spent fighting forest fires, creation and intenance of an 8,300-acre game refuge, and 28 miles of stream improvements.


"Over 100 miles of all-weather roads have been built and maintained," according to the annual. "This includes twenty-three bridges of different types and sizes, and roadside beautification work completed. Two roadside vistas, of native rock, have been built."

With its angular design, grapevine mortar, and sandstone and novaculite rock construction, the Sugar Creek Vista Overlook differs from the other overlook known to have been built by Company 742, or for that matter to have been built in the entire Ouachita National Forest. It stands today as a testament to the hard work and skilled workmanship of the men of the Civilian Conservation Corps.


